A MILE-HIGH MEETING ENSURES A WINNING WEEKEND IN 'SIN CITY'

AFTER 34 YEARS OF PROGRESSIVE DRINKING, MY LAST YEAR-AND-A-HALF WAS SOLELY FOCUSED ON MY ADDICTION. DAILY AROUND 2 P.M. I WOULD RACE TO THE BATHROOM. THESE TRIPS CONSISTED OF EXTREME VOMITING WITH TRACES OF BLOOD, BUT THREE DAYS A WEEK I DESPERATELY TRIED TO GET TO MY BAR SHIFT BY 5 P.M. MY WORLD HAD BECOME SMALL. AFTER ANOTHER NIGHT OF ORDINARY LIVING THAT CONSISTED OF JUST TRYING TO STAY ALIVE, MY WORLD COMPLETELY CHANGED. MY DISEASE WAS KILLING ME AND SUDDENLY MY DESIRE TO LIVE WAS STRONGER THAN MY DISEASE. A SHIFT OCCURRED THAT GAVE ME THE COURAGE TO ASK FOR HELP. TODAY I KNOW GOD STEPPED INTO MY MISERABLE LIFE THAT NIGHT. ON NOV. 21, 2002, I PICKED UP A SURRENDER CHIP AT A MEETING OF ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS. THANKS TO THE PROGRAM OF ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS, THE WONDERFUL GROUP OF PEOPLE AND GOD, I HAVE NOT HAD A DRINK OF ALCOHOL SINCE. I LOVED BEING FREE FROM THE HOLD MY DISEASE HAD OVER ME. THE PROGRAM GAVE ME TOOLS TO USE, SO I WENT OUT INTO THE WORLD AND USED THEM. MY LIFE HAD BECOME REWARDING AND PURPOSEFUL.

GOD WAS VERY GOOD TO ME FROM THE BEGINNING OF MY RECOVERY. WITH ONLY 14 MONTHS OF RECOVERY, I SECURED A MANAGEMENT POSITION WITH A GREAT COMPANY. ALONG WITH THIS POSITION CAME A YEARLY TRIP TO LAS VEGAS FOR A MANDATORY CONFERENCE. AS I LISTENED TO WAR STORIES FROM PREVIOUS YEARS MY HEART WOULD SKIP. NOT IN THAT NEW, SAFE AND EXCITING MISSING OF A BEAT, BUT WITH A COMBINATION OF PANIC, NAUSEA AND PARALYZING FEAR. I SPENT WEEKS THINKING AND PLANNING MY FIRST BUSINESS TRIP IN RECOVERY.

I SHARED ABOUT THE TRIP AT MEETINGS AND MANY GREAT IDEAS WERE GIVEN TO ME. THE FEAR OF DRINKING MADE IT EASY TO FOLLOW THE SUGGESTIONS. I WENT ONLINE AND PRINTED OUT A LIST OF VEGAS MEETINGS. DILIGENTLY I HIGHLIGHTED THE MEETINGS THAT WERE CLOSE TO MY HOTEL. A SOBRIETY SISTER IN THE ROOMS GAVE ME THE PHONE NUMBER OF AN AA MEMBER IN LAS VEGAS.

THE MORNING FINALLY CAME TO GET ON THE PLANE. WITH MY BIG BOOK IN TOW I SETTLED INTO MY WINDOW SEAT AND STARTED TO PRAY AGAIN FOR GOD'S WILL. I ALREADY KNEW THAT HELPING ANOTHER ALCOHOLIC WAS THE STRONGEST DEFENSE AGAINST TAKING THAT FIRST DRINK.

ONE OF THE LAST PASSENGERS TO GET ON THE PLANE SAT IN THE AISLE SEAT IN THE SAME ROW AS ME. THE MAN'S RESTLESSNESS KEPT INTERRUPTING MY PRAYERS. WITHOUT RESERVATION, I PULLED OUT MY SLIGHTLY WORN BIG BOOK AND STARTED TO READ. THIS IS THE ANSWER TO MY DISCOMFORT, I THOUGHT. I DIDN'T GET TO READ MUCH BEFORE THE MAN TWO SEATS OVER ANNOUNCED THAT HE WAS ON HIS WAY TO VEGAS, WHERE HIS BROTHER WAS PICKING HIM UP AND TAKING HIM TO A TREATMENT CENTER. AFTER THOSE FEW WORDS LEFT HIS MOUTH AND ENTERED MY BEING, MY UNEASINESS LEFT ME. I LISTENED TO THE PAIN AND FEAR IN THAT MAN THAT MORNING AND WAS ABLE TO FIND RELIEF FROM MY OWN. WE READ FROM THE BIG BOOK TOGETHER, TALKED RECOVERY AND HAD OUR MEETING.

THE REST OF MY TRIP WAS JUST AS MAGICAL--NOT VEGAS GLITTER AND HYPE, BUT THE AWARENESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE EVERYWHERE, EVEN IN "SIN CITY." I WENT TO A MEETING WHILE I WAS THERE. IT WAS A NEW AND EXCITING EXPERIENCE. I WAS ALIVE AND SOBER IN LAS VEGAS. THIS TAUGHT ME THAT WHEN IN PROPER SPIRITUAL CONDITION I CAN GO ANYWHERE.

Group Contributions and the Pink Can

At the January H&I Steering Committee Meeting we heard from members that some group contribution baskets have come back with less money in them than is put in the Pink Can. We do not want to take from the Intergroups/Central Offices, Districts, and other services that the group supports. We can never tell a group what to do but after some discussion we agreed that as committee members our response is:

We ask that the group contribution basket be passed completely before the Pink Can is passed and that the Pink Can is not passed inside the group basket. That the Pink Can either be passed after the group basket is completed or be left on the table with a brief announcement about the purpose of the Pink Can.

We have not asked that the Pink Can no longer be passed at meetings and we have not said we no longer need contributions. As long as there are confined alcoholics there is the need to purchase AA books to bring the message of Alcoholics Anonymous to them.

We have a letter called What Are Those Pink Cans For? which states "One of the fears expressed early on in the implementation of the Pink Cans was that they would subtract from the support of the meetings. This should not happen if the AA group secretaries announce (before the baskets are passed) both the importance of supporting your group (thereby supporting the service entities it contributes to) and the purpose of the Pink Can. Also, the H&I Committee requests that the Pink Cans be passed separately from the baskets so as to avoid confusion." The entire letter is available on our website at www.handinorcal.org.

More volunteers are also needed to bring those AA books into the hundreds of facilities we go into each month. It is when one alcoholic shares with another alcoholic that the message of hope is carried, so consider this 12th Step service and attend your Area H&I Committee Meeting to get involved.
